

What is the Public Service Commission (PSC)?

Georgia's Public Service Commission (PSC) is a 5 member board that regulates the rates charged and the services provided by most investor-owned utilities operating in the state:

- telecommunications,
- natural gas, and
- electric utilities.

How does the PSC impact us?

✓ Our utility bills.

The PSC helps determine the cost of our utility bills for companies like Georgia Power, Atlanta Gas Light Co., and Liberty Utilities.

✓ Our energy future.


PSC commissioners make decisions about Georgia's energy future and help dictate how much of Georgia's energy comes from fossil fuels, like gas and coal, or if they derive from renewable energy sources.

PSC elections are coming – make your voice count!

Two commissioners are up for election this year and everyone can participate:

> Primary: June 17, 2025 Election: November 4, 2025

The five members of the PSC must live in and represent one of five districts, but elections are held in a statewide vote. This means you can vote in all PSC elections, regardless of the district where you live. Districts 2 and 3 are up for election this year.
